

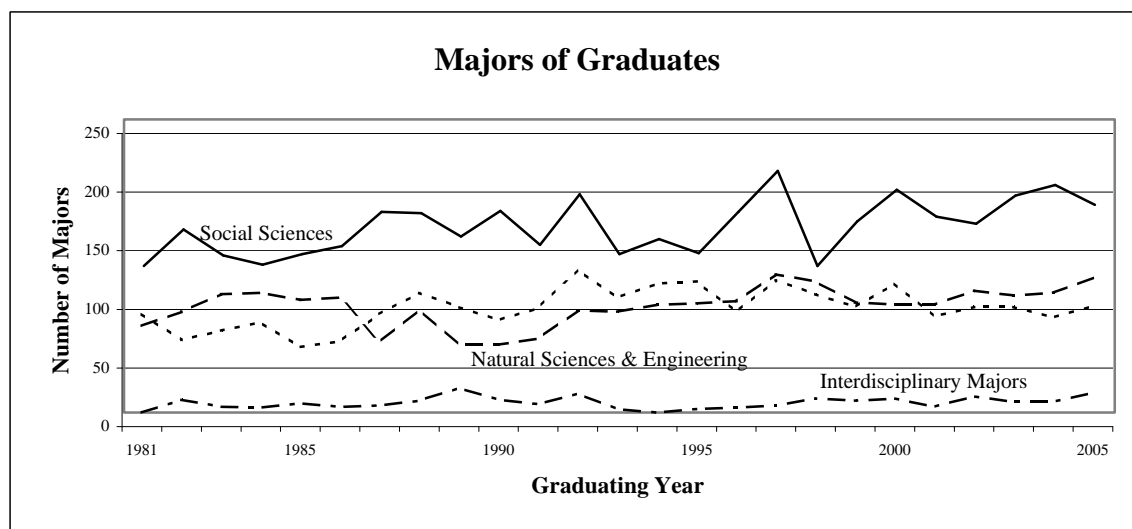


Graduating Class of 2005

On May 29, Swarthmore College awarded 395 degrees to 380 graduates. Fifteen students earned both the BA and the BS, compared with fewer than 10 in any single year of the past 25 years.

Consistent with recent years, 51% of the graduates were women. About a third (32%) were members of minority groups, and 5% were non-resident aliens. Well over a third (47%) of the majors were in the Social Sciences, 33% were in the Natural Sciences and Engineering, and 8% had interdisciplinary majors.



Two hundred forty-three graduates earned 276 minors, 109 in Honors, and 167 in Course. Nearly a third of the students earned some form of Honors, 49 with Honors, 64 with High Honors, and 12 with Highest Honors. (See historical data presented on last page of this summary.)

The proportion of graduating seniors who have studied abroad continues to be between a third and a half. In the Class of 2005, 39% of the students had studied abroad, compared to 43% in the Class of 2004.
